		<p>He became a test pilot. He flew all sorts of experimental planes testing them out to see how well they flew. It was a dangerous job, but very exciting. He flew over 200 different types of aircraft. He worked with NASA and trained for 7 years before he was sent on the Apollo mission. To understand the importance of this event</u></p> <p><u>Context: Moon Landing</u></p>	<p><u>Why is the moon landing famous?</u> The simple reason is that it had never been done before - and it was a big ambition for countries, and their space programmes, to be the first to land a human on the Moon's surface.</p> <p>The footprints made by Armstrong are still on the Moon.
