## Attendance & Punctuality

Thank you to all our families for supporting our attendance policy. Our whole school target for this year is 95% and we are currently at 92.8%, so we would really appreciate everyone's effort in improving this. We understand that children do get ill and we really appreciate that you keep communicating with school when your child is absent for any reason.

Can we also emphasise the importance of being in school on time as there have been numerous incidents of some families routinely being late for morning registration. Children need to be in their class at 8:50am promptly. Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks and many will miss vital phonics lessons.

## Guidelines

We would like to remind you about the guidelines we have to ensure everyone keeps safe on our school grounds:

**Dogs are not allowed on the school site.**

We ask you not to bring dogs onto the school premises at all as, whilst they may be family pets, some children are frightened of them, and dogs can also react to the large numbers of young children at the start and end of the school day. There is also a health and safety risk if dogs foul the play areas. You could arrange to meet your children outside one of the school gates or leave your dog at home.

**Bicycles and scooters should be wheeled and not ridden on the school site.**

We positively encourage children to walk or cycle to school and we have our own bike and scooter store on site. Please ensure that once on the school grounds that your child gets off their scooter or bike and walks it across the playground. This will keep everyone in the playground safe.

**Parents are asked not to send children to school wearing jewellery.**

This is on safety grounds as rings, necklaces, earrings etc. can be hazardous for both the wearer and others.

The exceptions to this rule are small (not dangling) ear-ring studs in pierced ears. Watches are also permitted. Earrings and watches must be removed during PE and games on health and safety grounds. Staff are not permitted to remove earrings. Plasters from home must be sent into school for PE lessons and sports events to cover earrings which cannot be removed for the first six weeks after piercing. School takes no responsibility for their safe keeping.

**Drinks bottles**

Can we please remind parents to ensure that when sending in a drinks bottle to school with children, it is clearly labelled with your child's name. Drinks that are for pupils to access during lesson times must contain water only as opposed to juice or squash. This allows for easier cleaning and less damage to the children's books if there is a spillage and also considering health benefits.

## Office Information

**Medication**

If your child requires medication, it must be brought into the school office and an administration of medication form completed. At the end of the school day, please call in to the school office to collect the medication.

**Asthma**

If your child is Asthmatic, please can parents contact the office to ensure we have the correct up to date details on our records and to check expiry dates. Thank you.

**MCAS Payments**

We would ask if you could check for any outstanding payments on MCAS for school dinners, trips and snack. We are monitoring these payments weekly and will be contacting parents who fall behind to avoid any unnecessary debts building up. Please can we also ask that payments are made weekly and if anyone is experiencing any problems, please contact the school office who will be more than happy to help you.
