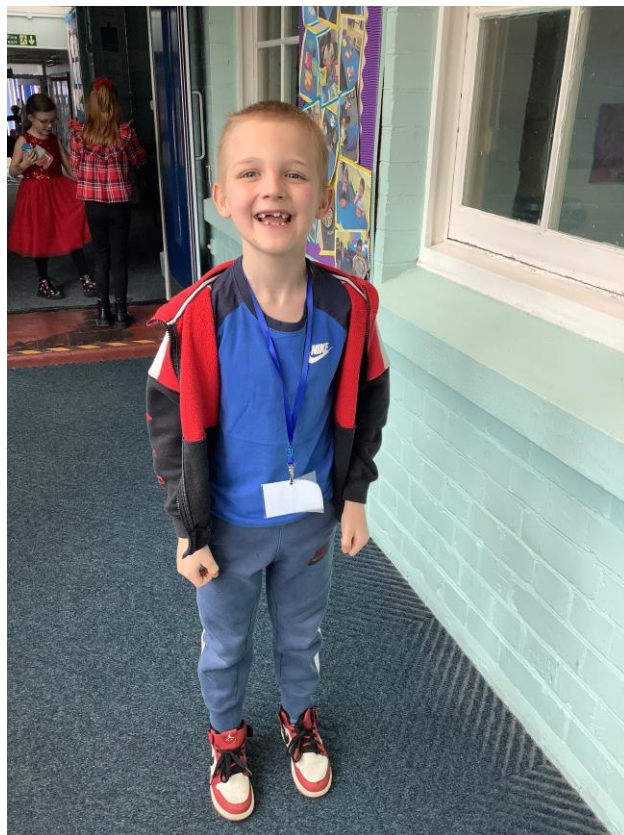
















Story Time Suitcases
