Lets Take Our Learning Outside

"There is no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong clothing."

We try not to let the cold, rain, snow or ice stop outdoor play and learning as it brings such great benefits:

- keeps children physically active
- allows large-scale play from den building to large sand sculptures
- encourages interaction with the natural world
- encourages problem solving and collaboration
- enables imaginative play
- For this reason, we are asking our EYFS parents to send their children in with wellies and waterproof clothing. If you would like to send in a puddle suit for your child which can stay in school, that would be great!

When we enter the winter months, we will also ask for hats, scarves and gloves to come into school. We are happy to store outdoor clothing for parents rather than you bring them to and from school each day.

We do please ask that all clothing is **clearly labelled with your child's name**.

Children (and adults) need to be dry, warm and comfortable when learning and playing outside, with clothing that allows for lots of movement. Outfits need to be fit for purpose and ready to get muddy and wet regularly! Getting clothing right is so important for the success and happiness of outdoor learning and overall happiness of all our pupils.

Class Homework Projects

Please see individual class homework projects that will need to be completed and handed in to their class teacher by Monday 6th November.

Year 1	<p>We would like to do a project all about me. This is an opportunity for the children to showcase who they are, who is in their family, where do they live, what do they like to do outside of school, any clubs and there interests. The children can present this how they would like to weather it is through photos or writing. Just for them to be creative and colourful.</p>
Year 2	<p>Year 2 homework project this half term will be to interview a parent/grandparent about their toys when they were younger and to make a comparison in any way they choose between what they played with and what the children play with now. This could be through a box showing models of the toys, an interview and pictures on big paper.</p>
Year 3	<p>Stone Age Project: Children are encouraged to create a piece of work/art in relation to the stone age. This could be a PowerPoint presentation, model of the stonehenge, timeline, fact file, creating your own tools, creating a survival box or something very creative that could be used for display.</p>
Year 4	<p>Year 4's autumn topic is Ancient Greece. Their homework task is to make a Spartan helmet or design a shield that would be used in battle. Projects to be completed by week commencing 6th November 2023.</p>
Year 5	<p>What was a typical home like during Ancient Egyptian times? Draw, design or make a model of a typical home during Ancient Egyptian times. Label the key features of the home and what they were used for. Be as creative as you can be!</p>
Year 6	<p>As part of our topic Road Trip USA, children are going to create a brochure advertising the great places that you can see from The Grand Canyon to the Statue of Liberty. Children will need to research at least 2 places, up to a maximum of 5 places they would like to visit and persuade people as to why they should go there on holiday or a visit. This can be done on paper, on PowerPoint, as a word document or another form of presentation, the choice is yours.</p>

Class Learning

Please see your child's class learning for week commencing; 18/09/2023

Nursery: This week we will be reading a non-fiction text called 'Let's Build a house'. We will be learning about different types of houses and the children will be encouraged to talk about the type of home they live in.

We will be making our own homes using a variety of wooden blocks and materials. The children will also be making their own shape house picture linked to maths. There will also be creative opportunities to paint, draw and cut/stick.

Reception: My family Following on from last week we will start to look at our families and the special people in our lives who look after us and love us.

Class 1: In Maths we will be how to represent numbers, recognise numbers as words and counting on from a given number.

In Science we will be starting a new topic and we will be looking at different types of materials.

Class 2: Maths- partitioning numbers to 100. English- continuing work on our book The Snail and The Whale to use adjectives. Geography- creating our own weather charts.

Class 3: Geography: United kingdom – Looking at how to use maps, looking at Capital Cities and how to use directional language. Writing: Building up to writing an adventure story in relation to The Stone Age.

Science: Light – To investigate how we see light

Home learning – Please keep encouraging your children to read at home and visit the Rollama website each day.

Class 4: Maths- Place Value- representing and partitioning numbers to 10,000, English- The Lost Happy Endings- looking at the features of a diary, Reading- The Girl Who Stole an Elephant, Music- Mamma Mia- learning to sing the song and playing the glockenspiel.

Class 5: In English, Year 5 will be looking at the features of a Newspaper report, ready to write our own the following week. In Science, we will be looking at different types of forces and whether they are a push or pull type of force. Our afternoon focuses will be Music and PSHE. In music, we will be playing, improvising and composing with the song 'Livin' on a Prayer'. In PSHE we will be looking at children's rights and how these are incorporated into children's daily life

Class 6: English - Poetry about refugees, Maths - Compare, order and rounding numbers, Science - explore the work of Carl Linnaeus, Computing - We are computational thinkers

Parent Volunteers

We currently have a handful of parent volunteers that take time out of their busy weeks to help and support us in school to do 1:1 reading with the children. Please can I encourage more to go through the process and offer some time if they can, you will even have the opportunity to have lunch with your children in school on those days.
