Once you have reached the Renaissance Accelerated Reader homepage, children will:

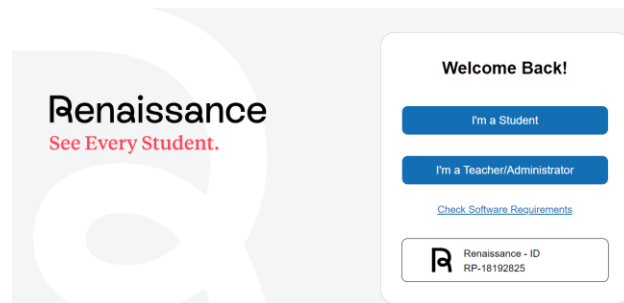
- Enter their login details.

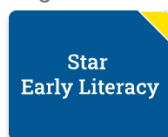

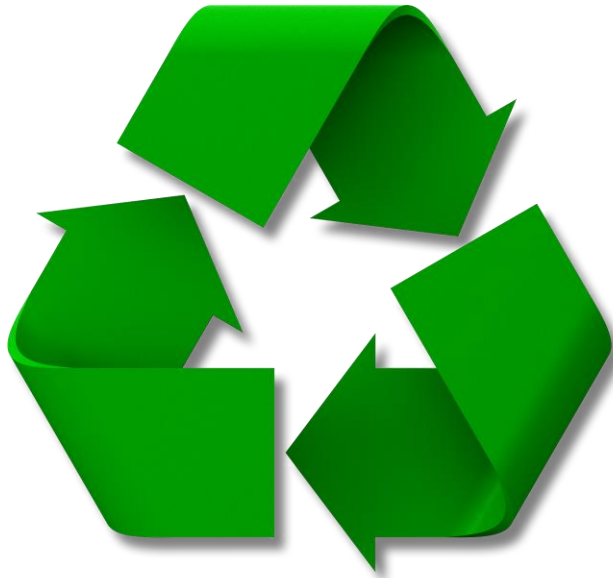

Class Learning

Nursery: We will be reading Kipper's Birthday, the children will be learning about how birthdays are celebrated.

Reception: We will be looking at our feelings and emotions and how we manage them.

Class 1: Science we are testing different materials to see which materials are best to for an umbrella, Maths we are learning to identify one more and one less than a given number.

Class 2: We will be finishing off our geography unit of weather and starting our history unit of toys. In maths we will be looking at number lines and using them to estimate and count and in English we will be writing our own adventure stories in the style of the Snail and the Whale.

Class 3: History: The Stone Age, Writing: Completing our Adventure stories based on a Stone Age girl time travelling to our world, Maths: Completing our great understanding of place value and partitioning.

Class 4: English- The Lost Happy Endings- Writing a diary entry, Reading- The Girl Who Stole an Elephant, Maths- Place Value- compare and order numbers to 10,000.

Computing- We are software developers- learning to code programmes.

Class 5: Next week, Year 5 will be looking at rounding numbers in maths to the nearest 10,100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000.

In English, children will be writing a newspaper report on the topic of homelessness.

Our focus subject next week will be art. Children will be practicing their drawing skills, focusing on the artist Henri Rousseau.

Class 6: In year 6 next week we will be exploring newspaper articles as we build up to writing a newspaper report on the book we are studying. In Maths, children will identify multiples, prime numbers and factors as we delve deeper into our understanding of times tables. In Science, children will study how we classify animals and the reasons for doing this. In PSHE year 6, will explore the rights that we all have and the behaviors that are expected of everyone as well as how we can make a difference in the world.
