Homework Projects

Just to remind you that all homework Projects will need to be handed in on Monday 6th November.

Year 1	We would like to do a project all about me. This is an opportunity for the children to showcase who they are, who is in their family, where do they live, what do they like to do outside of school, any clubs and there interests. The children can present this how they would like to weather it is through photos or writing. Just for them to be creative and colourful.
Year 2	Year 2 homework project this half term will be to interview a parent/grandparent about their toys when they were younger and to make a comparison in any way they choose between what they played with and what the children play with now. This could be through a box showing models of the toys, an interview and pictures on big paper.
Year 3	Stone Age Project: Children are encouraged to create a piece of work/art in relation to the stone age. This could be a PowerPoint presentation, model of the stonehenge, timeline, fact file, creating your own tools, creating a survival box or something very creative that could be used for display.
Year 4	Year 4's autumn topic is Ancient Greece. Their homework task is to make a Spartan helmet or design a shield that would be used in battle. Projects to be completed by week commencing 6th November 2023.
Year 5	What was a typical home like during Ancient Egyptian times? Draw, design or make a model of a typical home during Ancient Egyptian times. Label the key features of the home and what they were used for. Be as creative as you can be!
Year 6	As part of our topic Road Trip USA, children are going to create a brochure advertising the great places that you can see from The Grand Canyon to the Statue of Liberty. Children will need to research at least 2 places, up to a maximum of 5 places they would like to visit and persuade people as to why they should go there on holiday or a visit. This can be done on paper, on PowerPoint, as a word document or another form of presentation, the choice is yours.

Class Learning- 06/11/2023

Nursery: We are learning about bonfire night and fireworks, we will be talking about how to keep themselves safe. There will be lots of opportunities to create fireworks pictures with a range of media.

Reception: This week we will look at Bonfire Night and why some people light bonfires and have fireworks to celebrate.

Class 1: In Maths Year 1 will be recapping addition and we will be starting subtraction. The children will use concrete resources to help with subtracting. In PE the children will start the new topic story time dancing. In this topic children will learn to move in different ways to express themselves to retell a story through their dancing.

Class 2: Within Maths, we will continue to work on our confidence of identifying and using number bonds within 20 to help us with our addition and subtraction skills In English, we will begin to explore our new class text which is the beautiful tale of, 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'. This week will be used to explore the story and vocabulary within it. In Science, our new topic is 'Everyday Materials', we will look at our ability to confidently distinguish and object and the material it is made form.


Class 3: Science- Forces and Magnets: To understand that forces are pushes and pulls. PE- Invaders Football: Learning all the skills of the game, rules, teamwork and respect with the aim of inspiring the next generation. (Please remember that children need to come into school in PE kit on first day back) RE and Spanish- Children will be focusing on different religions across two weeks as well as learning important and everyday Spanish words, phrases and sentences with the aim for children to have a conversation in Spanish.

Class 4: English- Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Reading- Charlie and the Chocolate Factory-vocabulary, predicting, summarising and retrieving. Maths- Addition and Subtraction- looking at inverse operations and solving problems with a 2-step context.

Class 5: In English, we will begin reading our new text, 'Clockwork' by Phillip Pulman. Children will be exploring the features of the text and understanding character. In Maths, children will be coming towards the end of their fractions unit, learning to subtract and add fractions with mixed numbers. In Music, children will be learning all about Jazz music. We will be listening, appraising and performing music.

Class 6:We have a very exciting term ahead for Year 6. In English, we will begin exploring our new text - Wonder. We will make predictions about the book and explore how we use evidence to answer questions from it. In writing, we will form our own precept's, exploring their importance as well as looking at the language used in a discussion text. In Maths, we will continue to explore fractions. Children will convert mixed numbers into improper fractions and vice versa and begin to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers. In Science, we will begin our Science topic on electricity, exploring the life of Alessandro Volta. We will learn about why he was a pioneer when it came to electricity. Finally in PSHE, we explore that there are different perceptions of what being normal is and the stereotypes people often make.
