### Class Learning

**Nursery:** Next week we are starting our Space topic we will be using the story Whatever Next as a hook for learning

Children will be roleplaying and sequencing the story

Reception: Autumn and Winter- we will focus on seasons in particular Autumn and Winter. We will discuss the changes in the weather and types of clothing we wear.

**Class 1:** Maths - We will be continuing with our addition and subtraction and using number lines to help us,

English - We have currently been reading The Tiger Who Came To Tea and next week the children will be writing their own narrative where the children will be writing about animal who came to visit them for tea.

In the afternoons the children will be starting our new topic with Jigsaw Jack in PSHE and we will be celebrating differences.

Class 2: In Year 2 next week, the children will be writing a retelling in English, 'The Fish who was Afraid of Water' inspired by our class book 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark.' In Maths, they will be using subtraction to take away two-digit numbers. In computing, they will become game testers and will explore the rules and algorithms of how games work.

Class 3: Writing: Children will be writing their newspaper reports on the devastating news that The Iron Man invaded Featherstone Academy and destroyed parts of the school. They will be using their quotes from the people they interviewed and informing the public on who this mysterious giant is. DT: Children will be looking at the structures of castles and designing and building their own castles using a variety of different shapes. They will have the chance to design, build, decorate and evaluate their structures. Maths: We will be continuing our work in Multiplication and Division by using arrays and bar models to help our understanding.


**Class 4:** English- Charlie and the Chocolate Factory- planning, writing and editing a story from an imaginary world. Reading- Charlie and the Chocolate Factory- Summarising, retrieval, inference, vocabulary. Maths- Multiplication and Division. R.E- Celebrating harvest.

**Class 5:** In English next week, Year 5 will be writing a persuasive advert, persuading people to visit the fictional town of Glockenheim. In Maths, children will be focusing on subtraction and answering multistep word problems. In Computing, children will become Cryptographers and will learn how to send and receive messages using Morse and semaphore.

Class 6: Year 6 have an exciting week of lessons ahead. In Maths, children will explore multiplying and dividing fractions of numbers as well as finding fractions of amounts. In English, children will write their discussion text, presenting for and against argument related to, 'Should children be

homeschooled?' before concluding what the evidence shows. In reading, children will continue to explore the book we are reading, 'Wonder', answering a range of questions and discussing key characters within the story. Year 6 will explore electrical circuits in Science, making circuits from the diagrams and testing if the bulb will light up or not and giving reasons why. Our Science will also link to our Design and Technology topic this week as children will be planning, designing and creating a simple electrical game that involves having a steady hand. Children will then evaluate their own as well as each others games.
