Our First Word Millionaire


Wow! We are super excited to share that we have our first Word Millionaire at Featherstone Academy.


World Book Day - Thursday 7th March

We know how meticulously some of children plan their World Book Day outfits, so this year we are giving you all plenty of notice.


World Book Day changes lives through a love of books and shared reading. Its mission is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young person the opportunity to have a book of their own.

Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income. Spending **just 10 minutes** a **day** reading and sharing stories with children can make a crucial difference to their future success and it's fun for all involved.

World Book Day 2024 will be on **Thursday 7th March**, children of all ages will come together to share the joy of reading for pleasure. We are asking on that day for all children to come in dressed as their favourite character from a book they love. We are so excited to see who walks through our door on World Book Day and see where our reading takes us!

Class Learning

Nursery: Next week we will be sharing The Billy Goats Gruff in class. The children will have an opportunity to paint characters from the story. They will be learning new words to use to describe the Troll. We will also be look at the moral of the story and how the troll wasn't very kind. Children will also be able to use the props to act out the story.

Reception: Exploring Dinosaurs- talk about the different types of dinosaur, what they would of eaten and why there are no dinosaurs around today.

Class 1: Next week we are starting a new book called Can't you sleep little bear. We will be looking what the problem is and how resolve the problem with solutions. In maths we will be looking at number lines and estimating numbers. Towards the end of the week we will be comparing numbers within 50.

Class 2: In Maths next week we will begin our new unit of multiplication and division, focusing on making equal groups and introducing the multiplication symbol. In English we will start our new text 'Voices in the Park' and will be learning the features of a play script. In Computing we will be using iPads to take and edit photos inspired by the theme of winter.

Class 3: Writing- The children will be starting their class text 'Cliffhanger' by Jaqueline Wilson. The focus will be on Film Trailers with the purpose to entertain. Children will write their own 'cliffhangers' in the form of a film trailer for this book. Can they write an audio trailer that would be used on the radio to advertise this book?

Music- Children will be looking into Reggae music and music that spreads positivity. They will then create their own jamming sessions where they will combine these two genres and focus on pitch, tempo and rhythm.

Maths- Children will be consolidating their understand of multiplication and division with a focus on multiplying and dividing with 2 digit numbers.

Class 4: Maths- Multiplication and Division- diving a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. English- The Abominables- looking at the features of a character description- fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and varying sentence types. Reading- The Abominables- retrieval, summarising, inference, vocabulary and explaining.

Class 5: Next week, children will be continuing to read the book 'Rooftoppers' and explore character and setting within their Reading lessons. In English, children will be building up to writing a flashback, immersing themselves into the character of 'Vivienne'. Our focussed week next week is Art. Children will be exploring the artist Hans Holbein, and learning how to draw portraits of famous Tudor figures. They will focus on the skills of tone, shadow and perception, before creating their final piece of art.

Class 6:Year 6 have a great week of activities to look forward to. In Maths, children will be calculating angles on different lines as well as in shapes such as triangles. In reading, children will continue to read different stories from our Survivors book - exploring how to answer inference and retrieval questions. Year 6 will also use the book to help create ideas for their own story based on our class text. In Science, children will investigate shadows, deciding how and why they change. In PSHE, children will explore how we stay physically and mentally healthy, exploring how we deal with situations where we put ourselves under pressure or where others put pressure on us.


