Year 1 & Reception RWI Parents Workshop- Monday 15th April

On Monday 15th April, Miss Smith and Mrs Steatham will be hosting a RWI parents workshop which will start at 3:30pm. This session is especially for Year 1 and Reception parents, focusing on Set 2 and 3 sounds that children learn, as well as nonsense words. Within the lesson, word reading and strategies you can use to help and support your child at home will be shared. You will be shown what a speed sound lesson looks like and the key phrases that are used each day in school with your child. During the meeting, we will also be sharing information about the phonics screening test, which children in Year 1 will be sitting in summer term. We hope to see as many of you there as possible.

Accelerated Reader Quizzes At Home

A reminder for parents that children can access Accelerated Reading Quizzes at home. Each time pupils finish their reading book, they can take a Reading Practice Quiz to determine how well they understood the content of that book. This is something we complete in school and would love to also see being completed at home as ongoing home learning opportunities.

Once you have reached the Renaissance Accelerated Reader homepage, children will:


- 1.Enter their login details.

- 3. Then, they can then enter the book title for the quiz they would like to take.



Children are very familiar with the Accelerated Reader platform and will know what to do.


If you have any problems with logging in, please speak to your child's class teacher and they will be able to support you with any questions.

Attendance - W/C 08/04/24



Class Learning- W/C 15/04/24

Nursery- Next week our story is Rumble In The Jungle. We will be making a piece of art for our story display. We will be thinking about how animals survive in the jungle and thinking about what it is like to live in the jungle.

Reception- We will be looking at what we need to do to look after our bodies. We will begin to understand the importance of a healthy diet along with keeping fit and the ways we can do this.

Year 1- - In Maths the children will be counting in multiples of fives and learning how to count in fives to find a total. Also, children will be looking at using arrays and sharing a quantity using practical resources. In English children will be writing a wanted poster for Burglar Bill using adjectives and

exclamation marks. In RE children will be learning to explore different families and identify how each member of the family is valued.

Year 2- In Maths next week we will be exploring number bonds to 20 and in English we will begin planning our diary entries about Tuffy the cat. In History, we will be learning about amazing women and what they achieved.

Year 3- Computing- Children will be creating a presentation using Google Slides about themselves and their lives. They will be adding in computer animation, sounds, transitions and many more technological features. They will they have the opportunity to present to the rest of the class. Writing: Children will be writing their playscripts based on two characters from the class text 'Stig of the Dump'. They will think about character actions and dialogue as well as stage directions before performing it to the rest of the class. PE: Children will be focusing on improving their throwing techniques. They will learn how to throw in a variety of different ways and to use legs as well as arms when throwing.

Year 4- Maths- Shape- The children will understand angles as turns, identify angles and compare and order angles.

English- The children will produce a newspaper report reporting on the scene of a robot/ robots arriving at land.

Music- The Beatles- The children will listen to a variety of songs from the Beatles and identify the pulse, rhythm, pitch, dynamics and tempo. The children will also use recorders to play the song Blackbird.


PE- Athletics- The children will learn the techniques and practice throwing javelins.

Year 5- Next week, children will be writing a non-chronological report based on the Peasants Revolt that we have been learning about in our class text, 'Fire, Bed and Bone'. In Maths, children will be focusing on ordering fractions, decimals and percentages and continuing their work on finding the difference between negative numbers.

Our focus subject next week is PSHE. During our lessons, we will be focusing on what makes a positive relationship, how we should treat one another, and looking at how to ensure we stay safe online.

Year 6- Year six have an exciting week of learning ahead. We will be exploring 3D shapes and time in Maths. Children will apply their knowledge of time to then read time tables such as bus or train time tables. Year 6 will also look at a range of different texts in Reading. We will explore poetry and fiction this week, exploring the meaning of words we do not understand and how we can work these out as well as finding clues in the text to help us answer questions. In Writing, year 6 will explore punctuation, identifying and correcting sentences and ensuring we apply this in our writing. In Science, we will investigate what can damage our health and how this can impact us in the short, medium and long term.
